#### FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO VIRGINIA IN A BATTLE UP TWO TOP-FOUR TEAMS IN ACC RACE

Florida State plays host to Virginia on Saturday, February 10, 2024 at 8:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee in a battle of two of the top four teams in the ACC standings. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against the Cavaliers with a 7-4 conference mark and currently tied for fourth place in the conference standings. The Cavaliers arrive in Tallahassee in second place in the ACC standings with a 9-3 conference record. Florida State enters its game against Virginia having won seven of its last 10 games – all ACC games – since an 82-71 win over Georgia Tech on January 3 in a game played in Tallahassee. The Seminoles won five consecutive ACC games with victories over Georgia Tech (January 3, 82-71) Virginia Tech (January 6, 77-74), Wake Forest January 9, (87-82), at Notre Dame (January 13, 67-58), and at Miami (January 17, 84-75) to start the 2024 calendar year and added victories at Syracuse (January 23, 85-69) and most recently at Boston College (February 6, 63-62) to put their ACC record at 7-4. Following Saturday's game against Virginia, the Seminoles travel to play at Virginia Tech (February 13, 9:00 p.m.) before returning home to play host to Duke on Saturday, February 17 at 2:00 p.m.

#### SEMINOLES RANK AS ONE OF THE ACC HOTTEST TEAMS

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Virginia with a 7-3 record in last ten games. The Seminoles have won seven of their 10 games since an 81-72 win over Georgia Tech on January 3, 2024. Only Duke (8-2), North Carolina (8-2) and Virginia (8-2) have a better winning percentage and more victories in the last 10 games among each of the 15 teams than does Florida State.

#### HERE'S HOW CLOSE THIS SERIES IS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Virginia having won 28 of 56 games (28-28) against the Cavaliers since the series began on January 4, 1992. The Seminoles played host to the Cavaliers in the their first ever ACC home game at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Through 56 games, four overtime decisions (the Seminoles are 1-3 in overtime games against the Cavaliers), three ACC Tournament games (the Seminoles are 1-2 in ACC Tournament games against the Cavaliers), and six victories over the Cavaliers when they have played against Florida State as a nationally ranked opponent, the Seminoles have outscored Virginia by a 3,701-3,700 scoring margin. The average score of a Florida State against Virginia game is 66.08 – 66.07 (in favor of the Seminoles).

#### HAMILTON RANKS FIFTH IN ACC HISTORY FOR WINS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game against Virginia as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 417 wins. He is also the fifth winningest coach in ACC history for ACC regular season victories (166), ACC regular season and ACC Tournament wins combined (192). He is sixth in the ACC record book for ACC road wins (69), and eighth in ACC history for NCAA Tournament wins as an ACC Head Coach (18).

**SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS AT NOW AT 14 STRAIGHT WINS**

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Virginia having won an NCAA record 14 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 12 teams during its overtime streak, including Wake Forest on February 13, 2021, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles have defeated eight nationally ranked opponents in overtime during their streak, including No. 18/21 Colorado in the championship game of the 2023 Sunshine Slam earlier this season.

**SEMINOLES TOP ACC IN TEAM STEALS**

With double figure steals in each of the last four games, Florida State enters its contest against Virginia on Saturday as the ACC team-leader in steals. The Seminoles are one of two teams in the ACC who are averaging nine or more steals per game and one of only two teams who has earned 200 or more steals this season. Florida State earned its ACC season high of 13 steals – and turned those steals into a 19-5 advantage in points off of turnovers against the Eagles. The Seminoles scored 19 of the first 23 points of the game (and took a 19-4 lead at the 13:53 mark of the first half) with three steals and six points from three Boston College turnovers in the first seven minutes of their 63-62 win over the Eagles. Florida State has earned in double-figures in steals in six of 12 ACC games and earned its season-high of 17 steals in its 77-71 overtime victory over No. 18 Colorado in the Sunshine Slam in Daytona Beach on November 21.

**FLORIDA STATE'S STEALS BY THE NUMBERS...**

...Florida State has earned double-figures in steals in 50 percent (11 of 22) of its games including 55 percent (six of 11) of its ACC games;  
 ...Florida State earned its season-high of 17 steals in its victory over No. 18 Colorado on November 21, 2023;  
 ...Two Seminoles (Jamir Watkins and Darin Green Jr.) are tied for fourth in the ACC statistics in steals with identical 1.7 steals per game averages. Florida State (the ACC leader in steals at 9.5 steals per game) and Syracuse (ranked second in the ACC in steals per game with a 9.2 steals per game average) both have two players ranked in the top five for individual steals in the ACC statistics.

**FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC BY THE NUMBERS**

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Virginia with 209 steals and 90 blocked shots. The Seminoles are just 10 blocked shots from becoming the first team in the ACC this season with 200 steals and 100 blocked shots. The Seminoles' opponent on Saturday night, the Virginia Cavaliers, enters its game against Florida State with 186 steals and 116 blocked shots and are only 14 steals shy of also earning 200 steals and 100 blocked shots as a team.

**FLORIDA STATE BY THE DEFENSIVE NUMBERS**

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Virginia with 78 steals more and 29 blocked shots more than its opponents. With 209 steals, the Seminoles have 108 steals more than Clemson which enters this weekend's play with 101 steals through its first 22 games of the season.

## FLORIDA STATE VS. VIRGINIA – THE LAST MEETING

Virginia's Armaan Franklin scored a game-high 20 points on eight made field goals and four 3-pointers to lead No. 13 Virginia to their 13th victory of the season with a 67-58 win over the Seminoles on February 14, 2023 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Ben Vander Plas accompanied Franklin in double figure scoring with 15 points to improve Virginia's ACC record to 5-2. Florida State is now 3-4 in ACC play. Matthew Cleveland scored 10 points and 10 rebounds to earn his seventh consecutive double-double, a Seminole milestone that was last achieved by Reggie Royals during the 1971-72 season. Cam Corhen led the Seminoles in scoring with 15 points on six made field goals. This marked his sixth game of the season scoring in double figures. Darin Green Jr. played his 100th career game against Virginia. He played 82 games in three seasons at UCF and played his 18th game as a Seminole against the Cavaliers. He scored nine points against the Cavaliers.

## Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

**.520** Sophomore De'Ante Green is shooting .520 from the field (13 of 25) since making two of two field goals in the Seminoles' victory over Wake Forest on January 9, 2024.

**.667** Junior Jalen Warley is shooting .667 (12 of 18) from the field in the last two games. He was a near perfect nine of 10 from the field and tied his career-high with 23 points against Louisville on February 3.

**.793** Sophomore Cam Corhen is shooting .793 from the field (23 of 29) in the last six games. He was a perfect seven of seven from the field and scored 16 points at Miami (January 17) and was a perfect five of five from the field and scored 14 points at Louisville (February 3).

**.818** Junior Jalen Warley is shooting .818 from the free throw line (18 of 22) in the last eight games. He enters Saturday's game against Virginia having made five consecutive free throw as he was a perfect five of five from the line in scoring 23 points against Louisville.

**1.2** Sophomore Cam Corhen has seven steals in the last six games – a 1.2 steals per game average. He totaled a career-high three steals against Boston College (February 18, 2023) and earlier this season at Miami (January 17).

**1.4** With 41 steals in 35 games during the 2022-23 season, and 38 steals in 22 games during the 2023-24 season, Jamir Watkins is averaging 1.4 steals per game in the last two seasons (79 seals in 57 games).

## NOTING JAMIR WATKINS DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING STREAK

Junior Jamir Watkins enters Saturday's game against Virginia having scored in double figures in a career-best eight consecutive games (124 points / 15.5 points per game). He totaled is career-high of 27 points in Florida State's victory at Syracuse (January 23) and score 15 points each in the Seminoles' victory over Notre Dame (January 17) and against Clemson (January 20). Watkins is averaging a career-high 13.7 points per game and has scored 301 points in his first season as a Seminole. His single-season career-high of 334 points (9.5 points score per game) came during his second playing season (2022-23) at VCU.

## In FSU, A Legendary Opponent For All The Right Reasons

### Leonard Hamilton Is One Of The Game's Greatest Vestiges and Reminders of Why This Matters

**CHESTNUT HILL, Mass.** -- It doesn't take more than a cursory view of the record books to understand how college basketball grew into an international phenomenon. The game is growing thanks to the overseas appeal generated by both the NBA and March Madness, but the blending of Eurobasket and Pan-Asian superstars mixed the sport to unprecedented degrees. The overall burst of ongoing realignment and expansion simultaneously converted college basketball's reach to a national audience, but shifting the tectonic plates along international waters enriched the overall depth beyond anyone's wildest imagination.

The game is incredibly different, but even the global eradication of fault lines or borders hasn't done much to destroy the deep history teams possess in their home markets. The ensuing combination is showing players how to develop identities according to regional communities, and it's possible that the blend is now creating a situation where the best teams are the ones who can bring their old-school mentality to new-school classrooms.

A prime example is slated for tonight's game, when Boston College hosts Florida State in a matchup defined by two old school coaches. In an era of change, they represent a throwback to their state and region's older eras, and their ability to generate success is defined by their ability to read, learn, and adapt while maintaining a purpose that's greater than anything seen on the basketball court.

"What I've learned from [Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton] is to keep the main thing the main thing," said BC head coach *Earl Grant*. "It's not about me or about him because we're trying to help these young men. That's why we got into the business in the first place - to help these guys get a degree so they can go better their life. They can take care of their wife and kids, they can work a job, they can be successful, and they can make an impact in society as productive citizens by improving the man and improving the player."

Leonard Hamilton is one of college basketball's legendary head coaches, but his presence within the ACC took new meaning after the retirements of several of his seasoned Springfield-enshrined peers. Over the past five years, a league built on the oversized personalities on the sidelines lost some of its biggest competitors to a natural life cycle. Roy Williams' retirement in 2021 preceded Mike Krzyzewski's departure one year later, and Jim Boeheim joined them this year after spending 47 of his 54-year tenure at Syracuse as the Orange's head coach.

Hamilton - who should also have a second home in Springfield soon - has been in Tallahassee for 22 years but previously coached Miami for 10 years before a one-year stint with the NBA's Washington Wizards. His move to the Seminoles in 2002 preceded the Hurricanes' arrival in the ACC by two years, and he spent time coaching against two different tenures at his old job before Jim Larranaga arrived from George Mason in 2011. Since returning to the college ranks, the one-time Big East champion produced a record number of all-time wins for the team's program while clinching FSU's first conference tournament championship in 21 years and a second title when the postseason crown was awarded to the first place, regular season champion Seminoles during the COVID-cancelled 2020 tournament.

But what makes Hamilton truly special is what he's done away from the court. His fundraising efforts with the National Association of Basketball Coaches have helped raise over \$100 million for research funds with the American Cancer Society, and his constant presence elevated the profile of FSU's participation in the Coaches vs. Cancer movement, the nationwide three-point challenge, and annual suits and sneakers awareness games after he lost his grandmother, both of his parents, and two siblings to the disease.

That lifelong understanding defined his purpose and earned him recognition as one of sports' all-time greatest



human beings, and seeing him on any sideline is a reminder of service above self. He's widely recognized for his efforts - he was selected for recognition at the 13th Annual Dick Vitale Gala in 2018 - but it's the way he's treated people with respect and honor that makes FSU one of BC's most anticipated opponents on the basketball schedule.

"I think, for me, that's maybe what I've learned the most from him," Grant said. "The reason his longevity has been the way that it's been is because he's treated people the right way. His intent and his intentions and his purpose for doing what he does is pretty obvious."

Tuesday night is a game at its heart. The matchup between Boston College and Florida State carries huge ramifications within a standings table where the Eagles are two games behind the Seminoles and chasing down the next tier's breakaway pack. A team that struggled to nine wins last year after dealing with injuries is back into postseason contention with a 12-9 overall record and a 6-4 ACC record that's on the verge of pushing into second place.

Yet this game means more to a world where the transfer portal, NIL and one-and-done draft picks exceedingly permeates the conversation. Two coaches who are built from humble southern backgrounds will battle one another in a game built on respect and honor. Two teams that play similar, hard-nosed, rugged styles will look at one another and battle for a win before shaking hands with one another.

It won't get much better than this.

Boston College and Florida State tip-off on Tuesday night at 7 p.m. from Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts. The game will air live on the ACC network with online coverage available through ESPN's family of online and mobile device apps.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Junior Jamir Watkins scored a team-high 19 points on a perfect 11 of 11 shooting from the free throw line and sophomore Baba Miller scored a career-high 14 points to lead Florida State to an 87-82 win over Wake Forest at the Donald L.
